Weekly Presbytery Letter – June 29, 2016 Rev. Dr. Randy Moody, Stated Clerk of Peace River Presbytery

222nd GENERAL ASSEMBLY HIGHLIGHTS

The General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) met June 18-25 in Portland, OR, including 594 Commissioners, 141 Young Adult Advisory Delegates, 20 Theological Student Advisory Delegates, 8 Missionary Advisory Delegates, and 14 Ecumenical Advisory Delegates, plus Mid-Council Staff Members from the 171 presbyteries and hundreds of additional observers, to do the business of our denomination of more than one and a half million members. Peace River Presbytery participants at GA this year were Jeff DeYoe, Bill Teng, Gene & Claudia George, Jerry Fox, India Dennis, Lil Rea, Hmingi & Will Browne, Chris Carlson, Rebecca Deibert, Jack Haberer, Graham Hart, and Randy Moody. Highlights of the GA are listed in the following paragraphs.

Saturday: The Opening Worship featured organ, piano, hand bell choir and a combined choir from the host presbytery congregations in addition to a praise band. We remembered our Baptism, we called for Grace and Reconciliation, and we celebrated the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Worship is the highlight of General Assembly! In the evening session, Co-Moderators were elected for the first time in the history of the PCUSA: Jan Edmiston (Teaching Elder, Chicago Presbytery) and Denise Anderson (Teaching Elder, National Capital Presbytery).

Sunday: Transportation to area PCUSA congregations for worship was provided. The afternoon plenary session received the report of Stated Clerk Nominating Committee, during which J. Herbert Nelson (Teaching Elder, Mid-South) and Dave Baker (Teaching Elder, Tampa Bay) were nominated. The GA committees began their deliberations in the evening and concluded their work Tuesday.

Monday and Tuesday began with Bible study in each committee and the work of the committees continued morning, afternoon, and night each day!

Wednesday: Committees began reporting back to the plenary sessions. Leanne Van Dyk was confirmed as President of Columbia Theological Seminary and David Esterline as President of Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. Referred an amendment to the Directory for Worship for a vote by the presbyteries to make the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper more welcoming. A revised Directory for Worship in the Book of Order was referred to the presbyteries for a vote; it may be accessed here: https://www.pc-biz.org/#/search/3000018 The revised Directory for Worship began in 2006 and was referred by the 221st General Assembly in 2014 for study and comment leading to the current proposal. Approved the Belhar Confession to be added to the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church, Part 1, The Book of Confessions; this was the final step, having been approved by the 221st General Assembly and two-thirds of the presbyteries, so it is now a part of our Constitution. After approving the Presbyterian Church (USA) Child/Youth/Vulnerable Adult Protection Policy and Procedures, a public apology was made on behalf of the denomination by Stated Clerk Gradye Parsons to Teaching Elder Kris Schondelmeyer for the sexual abuse he suffered at the hands of a Lay Pastor in 2001 on a youth trip.

Thursday: Affirmed the work of the Board of Pensions, Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program, Presbyterian Publishing Corporation, and the Presbyterian Foundation. Alice Ridgill preached a wonderful sermon titled "Difference Makers", encouraging everyone, even those from different theological perspectives, to align our passion for serving God together; during the worship the Memorial Roll of Teaching Elders who graduated this life since the last General Assembly was displayed. The GA Commissioned 9 Mission Co-Workers for work around the globe; thanked 11 retiring Mission Co-Workers who offered 358 years total service. GA also recognized 85 Young Adult Volunteer Program

participants who dedicated a year of their lives to mission work. A 2020 Vision Team was established and charged to develop a guiding statement for the denomination to help us name and claim our denominational identity as we seek to follow the Spirit into the future. Also, a Way Forward Commission was established to study and identify a vision for the structure and function of the General Assembly agencies of the PC (USA).

Friday: The General Assembly elected J. Herbert Nelson to a four year term as Stated Clerk. The worship this day focused on being reconciled to God. Created a Task Force to revise the Rules of Discipline in the Book of Order. Called for the protection of children in Israel and Palestine and reaffirmed the PC(USA) position encouraging a two state solution. GA requested the Board of Pensions, Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program, and the Presbyterian Foundation to invest in potentially profitable alternative energy companies diversifying their energy investments as well as directing MRTI (Mission Responsibility Through Investment) to pursue corporate engagement on climate change issues. Affirmed Cuban and U.S. Mission Goals for the future.

Saturday: Approved a per capita budget for 2017 of \$12,735,784.00 and established per capita of \$7.33 for 2017 and per capita of \$7.55 for 2018. Larissa Kwong Abazia, Vice-Moderator of the 221st General Assembly, preached the closing worship service.

Please forgive the format of this article, but due to the volume of information included I attempted to be as brief as possible with the prose.
