Life in Peace River ... Conversations about Congregational Vitality

Over the next 2 years our Presbytery meetings will be focusing on congregational vitality. Ray Jones, in February, gave a broad overview of the topic. With his permission, I have attached the 7 Key Indicators that the PCUSA's Evangelism/Congregational Vitality ministry area has identified. Peace River's Steering Committee, Planning Team, and Congregational Vitality Team have adapted that and are lifting 5 key areas for our Presbytery's study and reflection. They are encouraging every session and congregation to engage in some self-assessment related to the each of the following areas, which are all essential for growing, vital, and alive congregations:

- Inspiring & Engaging Worship – May 2017
- Radical Generosity – September 2017
- Welcoming Relationships & Nurturing Discipleship – November 2017
- Organizational Health – February 2018
- Compassionate & Inclusive Outreach – May 2018

Before each meeting, the Clerk of Session and Pastor will be emailed a set of questions for the congregation's and session's reflections. Following each Presbytery meeting, the Planning Team and Congregational Vitality Team will send a set of follow-up questions.

The hope is to encourage the Presbytery and every congregation to have some intentional conversation about congregational vitality. One of the three core values of Peace River Presbytery is to be a "learning community." There is not so much a right answer, or a perfect way to address each of these themes, but we will have conversations, pray, share best practices, and learn together over the next 2 years.



When we visit a doctor, the very first thing the medical team does is to take our vital signs. If something is off, the doctor and patient together engage in a conversation. The doctor may even order some tests. Why? The doctor knows that ignoring them is not an option. The path to health is to:

- address, sooner rather than later, those issues which are important to our well-being,

- correct any deficit,
- and promote habits, activities, and a life-style that enhances our well-being.

Regarding congregational health and vitality - think of this 2-year presbytery emphasis as an extended visit and conversation to a doctor. However, our focus is not on our personal health; rather, it will be on the spiritual health of our congregation. One of the desired outcomes of this focus is to do what we can to learn together and encourage each of our congregations to be alive, vital and growing. Our topic for the May 18th Presbytery meeting in Arcadia is: Inspiring and Engaging Worship. Hope to see you all there!

This past Sunday, the youth group of Pine Shores Presbyterian Church, came to First Presbyterian Church, Port Charlotte and gave a check for \$3,000.00 to the food pantry of First, Port Charlotte. This is what Teri Jo Crego wrote about it on Facebook:

*“A wonderful day in worship today: Pine Shores Youth presented our food pantry at First Pres Port Charlotte \$3000 to make a difference in reducing food insecurity in our community; we had a beautiful cellist play with our choir and organist; 3 kids from our neighborhood who are becoming very involved helped read the Gospel lesson; [Graham Hart](#) was present and brought greetings from Peace River Presbytery; and I got to lead Communion with [Cori Rigney](#). A lot of healing has taken place at our church and I'm grateful for a presbytery that walks with congregations and is the best of the connectional church doing ministry together. Afterwards the youth helped our congregation learn how to use their smart phones-coaching them on a *variety of questions they had*. A good day.”*

Often, we talk about being a connectional church, or as we say in one aspect of our Presbytery's Mission/Vision Statement: connecting disciples in mission. That happened this past Sunday, and we thank the youth at Pine Shores for signs of connection and hope; even as we affirm the important ministry that First, Port Charlotte has with its food pantry.

To honor the policy that all ministers and ministerial inquirers and candidates shall be required to attend a seminar offered by the Presbytery **biennially** on the issues of sexual misconduct, a ***Faith Place Safety Workshop*** will be offered on **Tuesday, May 2nd** at First Presbyterian Church of Port Charlotte (2230 Harriet Street, Port Charlotte.)

If unable to participate in the Presbytery-offered training, the minister shall work with Presbytery to find a suitable alternative. Failure to comply may result in investigation and discipline.

We are fortunate that Patti Jung, Visiting Professor of Christian Ethics, St. Paul School of Theology, and author of “Professional Sexual Ethics”, has agreed to facilitate the workshop. This year’s offering will discuss: Child Protection to include such topics as mandatory reporting, confidentiality, two-deep adult leadership rule, screening of volunteers; background checks, and specific Florida law considerations.
