## ~ Following Jesus ~

Following Jesus can be a scary, unsettling business. Imagine the courage it took for the first followers of Jesus to take him at his word, risk the wrath or ridicule of friends and family to follow. One of the questions on my rather lengthy Heaven-bound list-of-questions is for the first followers. I'm curious. I want to know what it was about Jesus that made them do so.

It certainly wasn't his educational or occupational credentials. It wasn't his political connections or deep pocketbook. He didn't badger them into following or, in the words of Garrison Keillor, "play on their heartstrings like a cheap guitar". Why did they accept his invitation? Two qualities come to mind: first, the unexpected humility of a man who was obviously both brilliant and Godly, a rare mix. Second, the intimacy with which he spoke of God as "my father" ("my father and yours" in John 20:17).

During his earthly ministry Jesus made claims certain to shock some, intrigue or dismay others. The "I am sayings" with their allusion to the sacred name YHWH offer a perfect example:

I am the bread of life, *John 6: 35, 48*

I am the light of the world, *John 8: 12, 9:5*

Before Abraham was, I am, *John 8: 58*

I am the door, *John 10:9*

I am the good shepherd, *John 10:11*

I am the resurrection and the life, *John 11:25*

I am the way, the truth, and the life, *John 14:6*

I am the true vine, *John 15:1*

Were it not for the resurrection, I might be tempted to say that the "I am's" went too far – claiming more than any one person could claim. But the empty Tomb changes all that. Jesus' resurrection assures us that he can be trusted. In him *is* life, light, an open door and a protective shepherd. With him as *the* way, *the* truth and *the* life discipleship might still feel scary at times with its counter-cultural demands to love enemies, welcome strangers, and feed the hungry. But what a joy to know our God is with us and with the world God loves.
