Because we are constantly barraged with information, which makes it challenging to remember everything, I want to remind you again of our **Vitality Themes for Presbytery** this year: In May we considered Inspiring and Engaging Worship. Many of you found the panel discussion helpful. Others are beginning to use our pre- and post-presbytery scripture readings and questions for Session meetings to keep the whole presbytery learning together.

Our September 12-13 Gatherings in Port Charlotte will focus on Radical Generosity. To help us do that Robert Hay of the Presbyterian Foundation will lead three different sessions, each for a half-day with special attention to small, medium, and larger congregations. Please send members of your churches who are involved in stewardship and finance, or any ministry related to giving.

Here is a scripture reading and set of questions to share at Session meetings in August:

2 Corinthians 9:7-15 Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸ And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. ⁹ As it is written, "He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor; his righteousness endures forever." ¹⁰ He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. ¹¹ You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us; ¹² for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God. ¹³ Through the testing of this ministry you glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others, ¹⁴ while they long for you and pray for you because of the surpassing grace of God that he has given you. ¹⁵ Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift! At the May meeting of Peace River Presbytery, a new funding initiative was approved called **Blessing Grants**. This fund will be replenished using earnings from the invested corpus and any gifts designated for this purpose from organizations or individuals. So we invite your gifts to this great fund for Peace River Presbytery. We also invite your applications for projects that "support church development, redevelopment, and/or transformation:

- By initiating, altering or expanding outreach ministries in their local communities or;
- By creating PCUSA new church developments or worshipping communities.

The full description of the Blessing Grant Initiative and Application is available on the website, www.peaceriverpresbytery.org, and will be mailed to clerks and pastors. **The deadline for applications this year is October 1** and the amount available is up to \$25,000 for this first cycle.

Please carefully consider what new projects God might be calling your congregation or presbytery entity to engage. Remember that grants are ordinarily one-time gifts, not on-going nor emergency financial aid, so demonstrating the sustainability and innovation of your project will be key.
