

TENTS

Summertime has arrived and for many children it is time to go to camp. Most of us can fondly, I hope, remember our camp experiences. Although then and now campers are not usually housed in tents, some of us may have actually spent the night in a tent. Still today youngsters want to camp in their backyards in home-made tents.

The theme of tents has been percolating in my mind since we visited the newly opened Museum of the American Revolution in Philadelphia. This is a definite must if you are a history buff.




One of the primary exhibits is the original tent used by George Washington during the Revolutionary War. It is said to be the first oval office and housed his working and sleeping headquarters. General Washington was quoted as saying that he would stay with his troops no matter where they set up camp and his presence is considered a factor in the winning of the war.

Have you thought of yourself as a tent? Here's some Biblical background to prompt you...

The image of a tent plays a strong role in the Old Testament saga of the Hebrews' journey from Egypt to the promised land. As God led the people with the pillar of fire by night and pillar of cloud by day, they were able to feel God's presence. There are many references to the "tent of meeting" such as Exodus 33:7-9,

7 Now Moses used to take a tent and pitch it outside the camp some distance away, calling it the “tent of meeting.” Anyone inquiring of the Lord would go to the tent of meeting outside the camp. **8** And whenever Moses went out to the tent, all the people rose and stood at the entrances to their tents, watching Moses until he

entered the tent. **9** As Moses went into the tent, the pillar of cloud would come down and stay at the entrance, while the Lord spoke with Moses.

Providing a place to experience God’s presence first in the tent of meeting, then the Tabernacle, and ultimately the Temple, always signified the importance of God dwelling amongst the people.

In the New Testament, the tent theme continues with Christ announcing the coming of the indwelling Holy Spirit. Paul reminds us in his letter to the Corinthians, 2 Corinthians 6:16:

And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

As we journey through life what comfort and guidance we have in recognizing the gift of God’s indwelling spirit. May your tent be Spirit-filled.
