Weekly Presbytery Letter ~ November 21, 2017

Update from the Cuba Partnership Task Force

On October 5-10, a total of 18 pastors and spouses traveled from Peace River Presbytery to visit pastors, their spouses, churches and church members from Matanzas Presbytery in Cuba.

Cuba has thrived, despite many historical challenges and continued shortages (for the history of the Presbyterian church in Cuba, explore

www.cubapartnersnetwork.org). Each of the Peace River travelers had different experiences as we tried to experience and relate to the ministry and life of our Presbyterian brothers and sisters. All of us were moved in various ways.

Our hope is to build a partnership with the Presbyterian church there ... only 175 miles between the Southern end of our Presbytery and the city of Matanzas! While we have things to bring to the partnership, they have a LOT to teach us. One pastor from our group remarked that the church of Cuba has, "Learned contentment and can teach that to all of us here." But there is more; they have truly learned to trust and hope in God.

Challenges between the language, politics and governmental structures are quite real and cannot be ignored. As one of our colleagues in Cuba is so quick to say, "It is complicated." But there is one overriding factor that draws us together: Jesus Christ. And a potential partnership brings the opportunity not just for cross cultural experience, although exciting in itself, but for Christians from Peace River to see how the church has flourished as a distinct minority and even under persecution. There are also incredible future opportunities with everything from sharing seminary students to joint missions in our presbytery or with churches in Cuba to simply worshipping with each other. And this





is to be a partnership, not a mission. The emphasis is people to people, with the Holy Spirit. Cuba is not set up for hammer and nail teams from the U.S.

Next Steps ...

After discussions with our Cuban hosts, we propose that:

1. Peace River Presbytery begin to finalize a partnership agreement with the goal of having an agreement ready by the February 22nd Presbytery meeting. This will begin by looking at how other U.S. presbyteries have partnered with the Cuban church.
2. We organize another group to travel to Cuba in late Spring (April or May time frame). It is felt that it is essential that the bulk of this group be members/ruling elders that are looking to develop a congregation(s)-to-congregation(s) partnership. Various Peace River congregations in the U.S. may team up to form joint partnerships. Our congregations working together is a nice fringe benefit. 3. We continue to work to build a deeper relationship base. It was felt that it is essential for this to be a congregation supported partnership to ensure continuity of the ongoing partnership.

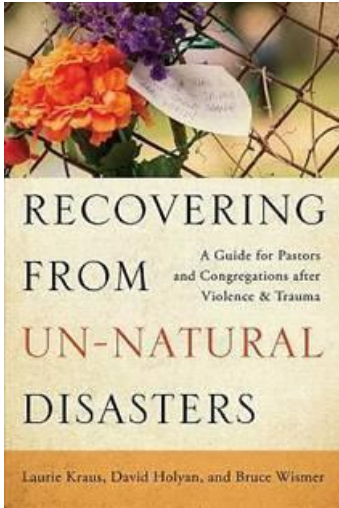
