# From the Hart

It is Easter week. Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed. That is our hope, the new reality from which we are invited to see the world and be in the world.

Yet, we live in a world, and I live my life more often than I want to admit, echoing the Apostle Paul's words, who also <u>after</u> Easter said: "I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate." Romans 7:15



Some specifics: 50 years ago today, Martin Luther King was assassinated. Looking back, as a high school student I thought, naively, that we would have come farther - much farther - than we have. The roots of racism are deep, and for many of us, including myself, we don't understand and often are blind to how seeds sown long ago continue to affect us (click here for a free e-mail book from Chalice Press - The Beloved Community Today: Voices of Justice and Hope Honor Martin Luther King, Jr.) This book has essays and sermons related to the legacy of Dr. King and the fight for justice within the context of North Carolina.

Two weeks ago, I shared in the Weekly Newsletter that the Coalition of Immokalee Workers and the Fair Food Campaign, which our denomination helped start, went to the Wendy's headquarters in New York to invite them to join with many other giant food corporations and sign onto the Fair Food Campaign (click here). They went with 100,000 letters and asked to meet with the hedge fund president who now owns Wendy's. That did not happen, instead the communication director of Wendy's issued a statement that basically said that the farmworker community was just taking advantage of the publicity that the #me too campaign had generated and was trying to ride on the coattails of that movement. The irony is that 20 years ago CIW took the lead in addressing the issues of sexual violence which 20 years later has brought much change and a safer work environment to the agricultural communities in our own back yard. I, with so many, had thought we would have come farther by now. Note - Miguel Estrada shared a powerful Lenten devotional message on the fight for justice (click here to read).

So, whether it is my blindness and sin that I must daily confront, or our corporate blindness and greed and prejudice that gets played out in our national life, what are we to do?

The Apostle Paul points us to a path. For him and us, he proclaims: "Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!" Romans 7:25

That is our Easter hope. Despite me ... and you ... God is not finished with this human project. For God so loved the world ... and keeps on loving that world ... That is why I affirm what Dr. King said on many occasions: The arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends toward justice (click here for additional background on that phrase).

Today I am thankful for our Easter hope, the legacy of Martin Luther King, and the work of CIW and the Fair Food Campaign. Also, I want to share a word of affirmation to pastors, chorus, church staff and church leaders who prepared long and hard to bring a clear, compelling word of hope, and the up-lifting and transforming message of Easter that "He is Risen."

I pray that the hundreds, if not thousands of guests, who attended our Easter services, will find their way back, even as we pray the Risen Christ will continue to work in all our hearts and this troubled work in which we live.
