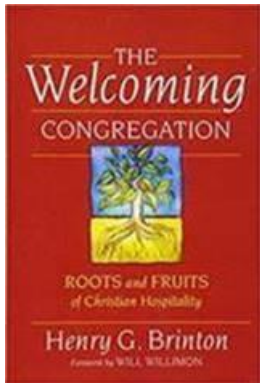

Dr. Robert Wilbur Cousar, Jr., honorably retired member of the Presbytery, on April 25, 2018, at Hope Hospice in Cape Coral. Bob and I live on Upper Captiva Island and started Upper Captiva Island Chapel in our Island home. Before moving here we served as missionaries in the Amazon Rainforest of Brazil from 1982 until 1995 in church planting. Although retired by the Presbyterian Church USA in 1991, we returned to Brazil where Bob joined the Presbytery of Amazonas-Roraima and we spent another four years planting another church in Tefe’, Amazonas. Bob served as organizing pastor of First Presbyterian, Brandon, FL; as well as pastor of a field of rural churches in Middle Tennessee Presbytery; pastor of Ray Memorial Presbyterian in Monroe, GA; taught Bible at King College in Bristol, TN. After receiving his PhD from University of Edinburgh, Scotland, in 1954, Bob went to Brazil and served four years as evangelistic missionary. He served in the Army Air Corp in WWII as a P-47 pilot and continued his love of flying in Brazil, piloting the mission plane in the northeast of Brazil in the 50’s.*
